# **New UP President Takes Helm**



Former UP
Regent succeeds
Concepcion as
the next UP
President
tty. Angelo A.
Jimenez took the
helm as the University of
the Philippines' 22nd
President last February

10, 2023, in UP Diliman, Quezon City.

The turnover ceremony was held at the iconic Quezon Hall Lobby, with outgoing UP President Danilo L. Concepcion and Jimenez delivering their respective valedictory and acceptance speeches.

Concepcion, a lawyer, is the 21st president of UP. He will be remembered as the UP president who "steered UP through the COVID-19 pandemic, enabling the University to contribute directly to the country's success in overcoming the public health crisis" and "led efforts to transform UP into the University of the Future," the program organizers said.

Under Concepcion's administration, the University instituted innovations in all its academic offerings and developed cutting-edge frontier programs. His administration raised UP's budget for research, secured additional faculty and staff items, increased economic and non-economic benefits for all UP employees, and provided support and learning assistance to faculty, students, and staff. Facilities and infrastructure were completed transforming the campuses. During his term, UP rose in World University rankings, such that it is now among the top 500 universities in the world and the top 100 in Asia.

Atty. Jimenez served in the UP Board of Regents, UP's highest governing body, twice, first as Student Regent in 1992 and as Regent from 2016 to 2021. From 1993 to 2007, he served the government by handling national interest cases at

the Office of the Secretary of Labor. He served with distinction in major global hotspots where OFWs have been endangered. As Labor Attaché from 1997 to 2005, Jimenez developed overseas labor markets and delivered a broad array of critical government services. Jimenez served as Deputy Administrator of the Overseas Workers Welfare Administration from 2005 to 2007. He garnered two Presidential citations for his performance in crises in Iraq and Lebanon. Jimenez is a published writer and an internationally recognized resource person on labor and migration.

In his vision paper, Jimenez speaks of a UP that is a "global university," and a research university focused on graduate and post-graduate programs and academic linkages. He sees UP continuing as a public service university helping government and industry while being a bastion of academic freedom. Jimenez advocates an Open Data Policy and digital transformation in learning and management. He also envisions UP helping raise the quality of undergraduate education in state universities and colleges.

Atty. Jimenez earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Sociology in 1987, and his Bachelor of Laws degree in 1994, both in UP Diliman. He passed the Bar in 1994. He was a Lee Kuan Yew Fellow of the Harvard Kennedy School of Government. He earned his Masters in Public Management from the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy at the National University of Singapore. Among the many awards he has received is the Outstanding Butuanon Award for Professional Excellence.

As UP President, Jimenez serves as the Chief Academic Officer, Head of the University Faculty, and Chief Executive Officer. He is tasked with pursuing goals stated in Republic Act No. 9500 or the UP Charter.



- <u>Community Service</u> We donate money yearly to different local charitable organizations in the Central Valley like the Modesto Gospel Mission for the homeless.

(Modesto) which is owned by our new lifetime members, Victorio and Silahis Pidlaoan.



## 2022 FALL BOARD MEETING

- II. <u>Call to Order:</u> President Susan Mendiola called the meeting to order at 1:00 PM. Susan thanked the UPAACC board members, officers and members for the success of the 40th Anniversary held on September, 24, 2022 at the DoubleTree Hotel in Modesto. The board members thanked Susan and Godie for their hospitality to hold the board meeting at their residence and for the delicious food.
- **III.** <u>Prayer:</u> The board members prayed for lunch and meeting led by Johnny Abilay.
- IV. Minutes of the Last General Meeting:

Rey suggested that the lifetime membership plaques and podium banner should not be included in the event expenses but to general expenses. It was also emphasized that the anniversary celebration was not intended as a fund-raising event. The main fund-raising project for 2022 was the UPAACC 2-year calendar (~\$ 8,010.00 income). Rey also pointed out the expense at the Summer general meeting at the Golden Harbor buffet in Fresno on June 11, 2022.

VI. <u>President's Report:</u> Susan Mendiola expressed her thanks to the board for all the support. The board members expressed thanks to the Modesto group for the successful event. Susan shared her experiences about the preparation for the 40th anniversary celebration. Rey Elizondo reminded everyone on how to access the pictures of the event. #### VII. Project Update:

A. UPAACC-Crisologo Cabacungan Scholarship: Rey Elizondo referred the board members to page 9 of the Fall 2022 newsletter. The UPAACC scholar Jhermien Paul Alejandria, graduated with

a BS Political Science (Magna Cum Laude) from UP Diliman, and his letter of gratitude to UPAACC is featured. We are currently waiting for the announcement for the new scholar starting 1st semester, 2022-2023.

(Questions: Do we want to meet the new scholar? Suggestions were made for the board to meet the new scholar via ZOOM or by one person and others could join. Susan Mendiola will set up the date as soon as the new scholar is announced by UP Office of Scholarships and Student Services (UP OSSS). It was also noted that Wilma Cabacungan donated specifically for the scholarship. Per Annabelle Atienza, for the donation, a 1098 FORM must be completed).

B. Balik Scientist - Dairy Cattle Project: Johnny Abilay gave an update published in the Fall 2022 newsletter. Johnny mentioned the 10-year Comprehensive Dairy Industry Development Program proposed as a collaboration project of DTRI and NDA. The mechanics for implementation have been drafted and reviewed. He said that Dr. Willie Dar, the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture had endorsed the implementation of the initiative. He mentioned that there is a need to go directly to the Philippine President for implementation. A letter to the President of the Philippines has been drafted. The balance of student assistant grant from UPAACC is PhP 350.000 (~US\$ 6.394 @ PhP 54.74 = 1US\$).

Johnny stated that there is a financial need for supplies. It was clarified that the supplies included equipment like microscopes. Rey Elizondo noted that \$ 1,500 was budgeted for student assistantship grant in the current 2022 budget but no money was allocated for supplies. Motion: Johnny made a motion to use the \$ 1,500 for supplies and equipment. The board approved diverting the \$ 1,500 for student assistantship to supplies/equipment. Johnny will communicate this to DTRI.

Rey Elizondo mentioned that the 5-year contract is over. He noted that UPAACC committed 5 years support to this project. Rey asked if UPAACC should continue. *Motion: To approve the project on a year-to-year basis.* 

**C. Computer Donation (2022):** UPAACC committed the computer donation of

## **UPAACC PROJECT IN ACTION**

AACC's seven (7) major continuing projects are supported annually through the general funds. Among them is the Annual Computer Hardware/Software donation to various campuses which was started 21 years ago.

In 2002, then UP President Francisco Nemenzo visited the Central Valley and met with the officers and members of UPAACC. In this meeting, President Nemenzo provided the Association with a "Wish List" from various UP campus in need such as laboratory supplies & equipment, computer hardware & software and textbooks. UPAACC committed to providing computer hardware and/or software in the amount of \$ 1,000 annually. Since 2002 this donation is rotated among the smaller UP campuses with limited budget such as Baguio, Cebu, Mindanao and Visayas (Iloilo).

In 2022, the recipient, UP Baguio, requested computer chairs instead of computer hardware/software. August Lansigan and Annabelle Atienza (UP Baguio graduate) coordinated this donation. This year's (2023) recipient will be UP Visayas (Iloilo). □

r. Helen Socorro Dagdag Reyes, of Jacksonville, Florida and formerly from Stockton, California, passed away after a prolonged illness on December 29, 2022 at the age of 68.

Helen was born to Arturo Horlanda Reyes and Cirila Dagdag Reyes in Camiling, Tarlac, Philippines on September 22, 1954. She studied premed at the University of the Philippines. Diliman and earned her medical degree at University of the Philippines College of Medicine.

In 1984, she immigrated to the United States and later finished her residency training in Pediatrics at the Kaiser Permanente Hospital in Oakland, California.

Helen was in private practice and later joined the Sutter-Gould Medical Group in Stockton and served the community for more than 25 years before her disability and retirement. Despite a busy career. Helen was an active member of First Baptist Church where she sang in the church choir.

She served as a member and President of the Filipino Medical and Allied Professionals (FILMAPS), a local organization that provides scholarship opportunities for Filipino-Americans with exemplary achievements in academics, sports or music. She was also a member of the FILMAPS Chorale and FILMAPS Dance Troupe, through which the group promoted Filipino cultural awareness throughout northern and central California.

Helen was also a member, Treasurer and President of the University of the Philippines Alumni Association in Central California (UPAACC) and a member and Treasurer of the University of the Philippines Medical Alumni Society in America, Northern California Chapter (NCC UPMASA). Both alumni organizations provide financial support to the different University of the Philippines colleges across the Philippines and to the charitable projects of the UP College of Medicine and Philippine General Hospital.

While Helen never married nor had any children, she was considered a second mom to all of her nephews and nieces and cared for them like her own children. Helen served many roles throughout her life: daughter, sister, Tita and Doctor. Because of her big heart, she was a positive influence in the lives of many beyond family and friends. She also leaves behind a legacy of dedication and service to her patients that spans generations.

Helen leaves to cherish her loving memory to her three sisters and brother: Maria Yolanda (Gregory), Amelia (Randy), Winnie Ruth (Kelly), and Roberto Antonio (Tammie); her 13 nieces and nephews, and ten grandchildren; uncles, aunts and cousins from both the Philippines and California.

She will be missed by all she touched in her 68 years of life.

## **UPAACC Project Updates**

- A. UPAACC-Crisologo Cabacungan Scholarship The UP Office of Student Services & Scholarships (OSSS) reported that they are in the process of selecting the next scholar. Likewise, the UP Foundation Office that manages the funds of the scholarship program indicated that the current balance of the scholarship fund is PhP1,417,925.63 (~US\$25,673 @ PhP 55.23 = 1US\$).
- B. Computer Donation In 2022, UPAACC donated 54 computer chairs to UP Baguio (see page 5) and this year's (2023) recipient is UP Visayas.
- C. Balik Scientist Program -
  - According to available information, there are only 24,000 milking cows in the country producing an average of 8.5 kgs per cow. The USA has 9 million dairy cows producing an average of 35 kgs per cow.
  - National Dairy Cattle Breeding Plan has been formulated and implemented.
     Frozen conventional and sex-sorted semen from proven genetically superior sires from the USA are used in the breeding program.
  - Major objective of the National Dairy Cattle Breeding Plan is to develop two genetically superior Philippine breeds of dairy cattle, the Philstein (Philippine

- Holstein) and the Philsey (Philippine Jersey).
- Unfavorable environmental factors, including high seasonal temperature and humidity, inadequate and lowquality feed supply, prevalence of cattle diseases and inadequate housing for dairy cattle cause low milk production. Fortunately, some human intervention can mitigate some of the harsh environmental situations.
- D. Community Service This year's (2023) recipient of the \$100 budgeted is Fresno.
- E. Annual Gift Program This ongoing program still needs more of our support. Last year's donation was only \$ 300. □

### **Grand Idea**

The University of the Philippines takes pride in its students, passionately

generating and sharing their ideas to address real-world problems and encouraging fellow scholars to thrive.

A UP Visayas 4th year student, Grand C. Gascon, was recognized as the only Chemical Engineering undergraduate and Filipino who became a finalist of Bayer's International Youth Agriculture Summit. Bayer's biennial

summit was sponsored by the Crop Science division of Bayer in partnership with the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network and Babele.

Gascon's pitch was on controlling the amount of light that reaches plants to improve their growth. He thought that if camera filters could reduce the amount of sunlight that could reach the camera's sensors, there are also ways to improve exposure to sunlight and apply these ideas to enhance plant growth and, ultimately, food production.
